ENJOYING RECYCLING AND THE CYCLE OF LIFE! Kids love to dig!! Allow the world of mud pies and dirty fingers to work its magic, stimulating the senses and sparking imaginative play. With every spadeful turned, with every poke in the dirt, children begin to make sense of the world around them. Children have a natural affinity with dirt, and it unfolds as they touch, smell and work with plants in the garden.

At Kindy, we have been busy making recycled paper pots by tearing up old newspapers and mulching them up with water. We plan to fill these pots with soil, then plant a sunflower seed in each one. As the seedlings grow, we will observe, draw and discuss the changes we witness before finally planting the seedling in our butterfly garden to create a bed of sunflowers for us to care for.

Every time a child offers a helping hand to plants or animal, they are learning how to nurture, to appreciate another living thing and to take responsibility for its wellbeing. When given the chance to nurture, their sense of self gets a boost and they begin to see things from other perspectives.

The children are beginning to understand that paper comes from trees, and that trees provide the oxygen we breathe- so it is important to be mindful of conserving our environment by recycling paper and cardboard. They are also avid recyclers at lunchtime. Their joint dedication to saving vegie scraps ensures our worms have an endless supply of food, and our plants have an endless supply of nutrients thanks to the worm castings... or "worm wee" as we like to call it!

Fiona & Lynsey's Red Group

Learning about the 5 senses has furthered our education this month. We began with gardening and planting our sunflower seeds (donated from Alex). The children prepared the garden bed – turning over the soil, adding potting mix, and some of our home-grown worm wee from our worm farm as fertilizer. Over the following days the children watered the ground in preparation for planting. During this time we created sunflower markers to place in the ground, and documented our guesses on how many days it would be before we saw the seeds turning into small plants. We continued to look at the environment around us - shapes and sizes of leaves (we took prints of these leaves onto paper), found beautiful flowers growing in the bottom part of our playground, collated seed into size and shape, and then used a mortar and pestle to ground dried seeds and herbs into pastes. Wow – what amazing smells were created!!! We thought about how we use our senses all the time as we play at kindergarten – touching the soil as we plant, looking at the variety of sizes of seeds, and smelling the crushed herbs. Stories such as retelling the "Great Big Enormous Turnip" and sequence cards of a growth of a plant helped solidify our learning. We are now looking at how plants "drink" the water with a colour changing experiment.

This month we have continued on the interest of sewing. Thanks to Miss Lynsey and her sewing machine, many of the children created some fashion statements of clothing – scarves, bags, skirts, hats and mermaid tails. They designed on paper what they wanted to create, chose fabric and accessories (ribbon, lace etc..) and then took their time carefully listening to Lynsey as they used the machine.

We hope all the mums enjoyed the special Mothers Day pampering and songs! Thanks for being such great sports as you experienced the short but well loved massage and hand rub from your child!

This personal responsibility of considering what action we can take to help a situation rather than changing others behaviour is a valuable life skill to develop in many areas of life.

We have also been working on the little garden in our entry space. We will be planting sunflowers to brighten it up for now and we are asking for your ideas about what we could do with this space in the future. Check out the red folder near the sign in book which has some pictures and ideas to get the inspiration going. We would love to make this a collaborative effort.

We just Love to see where the Pre-Kindy kids take us with their learning. After looking at lots of bugs and lizards earlier in the term, we started looking at our own bodies and all the bones we have "our Skeleton ". It was fun to hold up a pretend skeleton in the mirror and imagine our own bones, then draw bones on pictures of bodies.

This led onto what keeps our own bodies healthy, so we talked about what we eat, and what makes a healthy snack, it was fun seeing what food was in our snack boxes and who liked what foods, banana's were a great talking point, where and how they grow, and then we had to sing 'Banana's-in-pyjamas', but.. "Banana's-in-Pyjama's don't grow on tree's Miss Becky!"... They can at Kindy, so we set about making our own banana's in pyjama's tree O

To build on our talk about healthy food, I brought in lots of different fruits and vegetables, and we cut them open to see what was inside, some have pips and seeds and some didn't, and some even had a magic star! some taste nice, but lemons and limes make your face look funny when you taste them O

We then had lots of fun doing paint stamping with the different fruits, capsicum and kiwi fruits worked the best, and the citrus fruit made the paper smell nice.

Smell is a wonderful sense to build on so we made "smelly playdough"... This was a wonderful experience, mixing up warm playdough, each child was then able to add their own smells to it.. Cinnamon, camomile flowers, coriander and mustard seeds, some held their noses, some almost put their noses into it[©]... But each child was able to experience ownership over their own 'Smelly Playdough'.

As the days become a bit colder, Kindy can be rather chilly first thing in the morning and late afternoon, so rug up a bit, but remember to still put your child in clothes they can manage by themselves in the bathroom.
